



KEEPING UP WITH THE TIMES

Whether you like it or not-use it a little or a lot, technology is all around us influencing our daily lives. Social Media has revolutionized how instantly we can keep in touch & share our lives with others. Social networking sites require that you download to your devise an "app" an abbreviation for application, that once installed allows the software program to perform specific functions. You need to set-up an online account & profile and you're good to go.

<u>Twitter:</u> is about who you are following & who is following you <u>in real time</u> by posting very short "tweets" like a chirping bird, however you are limited to only 140-character post including the @ and # symbols. These two symbols have definite functions: use @ in front (nametag) username to send tweets to person you want, use # for hashtags. Hashtags identify the location of tweet subjects: example your tweet is about bridge dates, you could use #bridge. Trump is known as the twitter president.

<u>Instagram:</u> basically, a photo & video sharing app which is uploaded to your devise. Pre-approved followers & the public can view what you are up to. Videos are 60 sec & include creative editing tools to enhance your photos. Followers click "like it" the more likes the better your status. **Snapchat**: is also a photo & video app, however each post is accessible by others for <u>24 hours</u>. On Snapchat no profile is necessary or interaction with others.

<u>Facebook:</u> the giant of social-networking open to ages 13 & up is used by tens of millions, only a valid email address is needed. Users create a profile & photo is optional. Users make friends by accepting a "friend request". Users enjoy Facebook for fun, entertainment, games & interacting with others. Great for entrepreneurs & marketing, an inexpensive way to promote home or small businesses.

BBO: Bridge Base Online: (http: www.bridgebase.com) membership is free & regular games are available 24/7. On-line clubs offer an option to earn ACBL & ABA masterpoints by playing online tournaments, be advised a fee of BB\$ is \$1. You are welcome to look around site & you'll find free solitaire.
