## Innovators

Everything has a history, and Standard American bridge is without exception. While we may prefer to just play the game, its journey road post is, "you've come a long way baby." And with this in mind, you may find this quick read interesting for it will acquaint you with two of its early bidding innovators.

**Harold S. Vanderbilt** (1884-1970) created the first bidding system for the new game: the artificial and forcing  $I \clubsuit$  opening bid which allowed responder to respond  $I \clubsuit$  with any hand that was without an ace or king; then Vanderbilt changed the theory (innovation time). Opener should rebid with 2 notrump in which south describes his hand by bidding  $4 \clubsuit$ . Opener rebids 4 notrump indicating that hearts is his weak suit and when responder shows shape with a bid of  $5 \clubsuit$ , opener raises to slam. (See sample hand below.) Among his other innovations, concept of vulnerability, balanced scoring table which allowed for part-score. (HCPs and distribution points were not used at this time.)

**Alvin L. Roth** (1914-2007), considered one of the greatest bidding theorists of bridge, invented various bidding conventions including five-card major opening, negative doubles, forcing notrump and unusual notrump. The forcing notrump response (still popular) is a one level bid. Roth's unusual notrump convention is an overcall showing a two-suited hand, showing minor suits after opponents open in a major. The general concept is to show "two lowest unbid suits." Also, using a five-card major opening made it easier to incorporate forcing notrump bid.

## History in My Backyard America's Oldest Community Founded by Free Black People

Among my fondest childhood memories are visiting my great grandparents, Lewis "Pop Lewis" (1883-1972) and Geneva "Mom G" (1887-1979) Wilson. Their home on the eastern shore of Maryland, set back an acre from the unpaved road with a long dirt driveway leading to the house, lacked the modern conveniences we all are accustomed to. A pump outside the back porch provided water, the outhouse near the chicken coop, and bedrooms, each with a chamber pot and a vanity station containing a pitcher and bowl to wash up in the morning, were likely how most everyone in rural America lived during the 19<sup>th</sup> and early 20<sup>th</sup> century.

Pop Lewis had a funny way of calling for the chickens at feeding time and they would come running. One time, soon after arriving, he showed us a hen whose clutch of eggs had hatched the day before. What an adorable sight, a hen and at least a dozen little yellow fuzzy chicks. We visited for their 58<sup>th</sup> wedding anniversary, Pop Lewis' 87<sup>th</sup> birthday (it snowed on Easter Sunday that year and took nearly eight hours to drive home to the Bronx) and many times for no reason at all. Other family was often there too, traveling from Baltimore, Philadelphia, New Jersey, and Delaware. We feasted on crabs, ate scrapple with breakfast, some pitched horse shoes and played touch football, and all had a great time.

It was here that I first met Mom G's sister, my Aunt Cassie (Mary Cassandra Still; 1881-1979). Aunt Cassie, along with daughter Ruth and sons Carl and Norris, drove from Lawnside, New Jersey. She is the widow of Ephraim Jerome Still (1876-1941), a grand nephew of abolitionist William Still (1821-1902).

In 1938, Ephraim Still was elected mayor of Lawnside, New Jersey. Lawnside, established in 1840 during the abolitionist anti-slavery movement, is America's oldest community founded by free Black people. It was first named Free Haven, later changed to Snow Hill and then to Lawnside when the Philadelphia and Reading Railroad built a station there. In 1940, the centennial of its founding, Mayor Still described Lawnside as "a beautiful little town of neat homes and 1,500 inhabitants enjoying complete autonomy."






The Evening Sun, Sep 4 1940 Baltimore, Maryland



William Still (1821-1902) was an abolitionist, conductor on the Underground Railroad, businessman, writer, historian and civil rights activist. He directly aided fugitive slaves and also kept records of the people served in order to help families reunite.

## **ACBL Debuts** New Convention Card

With the new Alert procedures implemented last year, it was time for the convention card to be overhauled as well. A committee consisting of Danny Sprung, Chris Weigand, Linda Trent, Tom Dressing and Tom Carmichael was appointed to redesign the card. The product of their work is the new card you see here, which the Board approved during their meetings at the Austin NABC.

You may start seeing the new card as soon as now, although it could take several months for the existing cards in circulation to be replaced with the new one. During the transition, either card will be acceptable.

Much of the card should look familiar to those already using an ACBL convention card. The use of names for conventions has been limited where possible. Common abbreviations and terms used on the card are explained in the glossary on the facing page.

We will explain each section in detail over the next few months.

Note that each section is now separated with vertically shaded columns: Overview, Minors, Majors, Notrump, 2 Level, etc.

Rather than starting with notrump openings, the new card arranges opening bids in ascending order.

There are now separate areas for 1♣ and 1♦ opening bids. Those who treat these bids the same, opening the "better minor," don't need to fill out the minor sections twice; there is a check box which indicates "same as over 1♣."

The section on defensive carding methods has been greatly expanded with separate areas for leads against suits and notrump, carding and signals.

More room is given to explain general style for preempts and what is to be expected from a balanced opening bid.

The new Alert procedures have been incorporated with the same color coding: red = Alert, blue = Announce.

The new card contains many improvements designed to help opponents locate desired information efficiently and help partnerships with their own agreements. While it may seem like a lot of information – especially at first – it's perfectly fine to only fill out the areas that apply to your partnership.


